As the largest organization of combat veterans, VFW knows the importance of keeping military families in touch. That's why in 1996 VFW launched the *VFW Operation Uplink*™ program—the premiere calling program for deployed service members that provides free phone time to active-duty military personnel and hospitalized veterans.

The program is the only one of its kind, providing two or more designated days each month when deployed service members making phone calls from their Morale, Welfare & Recreation (MWR) center to the US and other home base location land lines, are greeted by a recording which states the call will be free, courtesy of *Operation Uplink*.



In January, we listed Post 2164 on six online search engines that focus on banquet hall rentals. We also developed a flyer that describes our rental program. Below are some quick facts about our rental program. Contact Bill Nates at (630) 668-8756 for details on planning your specific event.

- Our hall will accommodate 100-120 people, depending on table configuration and whether floor space is required for dancing.
- Decorating services may be contracted to transform the hall into the perfect setting for your event.
- Spacious wooden gazebo in shady backyard is ideal for picnics or barbecue events. Gazebo and yard may also be decorated in theme with your event.
- Large, well-lighted, paved parking lot can easily accommodate trucks and trailers.
- Rental cost is \$300. Military-affiliated events are discounted to \$150.
- Food is privately catered by vendor of your choosing. Music or entertainment is privately contracted by you.
- Cash bar or beverage packages are available. All liquor must be purchased through Post 2164, in accordance with the mandates of our liquor license.



2011-2012 ALL-AMERICAN POST Incorporated June 1931



On February 12, 1973, more than 140 American prisoners of war were set free from the notorious Hanoi Hilton. Among them was Air Force fighter pilot John Borling, who had been imprisoned there for over six years. No communication between the POWs was permitted so they devised a "Tap Code" to pass along information—and poems. Borling's book, *Taps on the Walls* commemorates the 40th anniversary of their release and is a tribute to "the power of the *unwritten* word."
